

The **Dormition Fast** begins **this Friday** and continues until the holiday of the Falling-Asleep of the Theotokos on August 15. Unfortunately, while many may know of this two-week period of abstinence, prayer, repentance and almsgiving, few follow it and more than a few do not know its purpose.

In a close-knit family, when the matriarch is on her deathbed, normal life comes to a halt. Things like parties, television, luxuries and personal desires become unimportant; life revolves around the dying matriarch. It is the same with us and our relationship with the Virgin Mary. The Church gives us this time of preparation to come to the bier and eulogize and entreat the woman who bore God, the vessel of our salvation and our chief advocate at His divine throne. As such, daily routines and the indulgence in personal wants should stop. Fasting, in its full sense (food, drink, entertainment), accomplishes this. Less time in leisure or other pursuits leaves more time for prayer and reflection on she who gave us Christ and became the first and greatest Christian. In contemplating her incomparable life, we see a model Christian life of obedience, love and commitment. This is our goal and this is the purpose of the Dormition Fast.

Through a long life of prayer and fasting, Mary was always prepared to meet her Son upon her falling asleep. In imitation of her, let us use this Fast to ready ourselves for our own earthly passing and a good account before the dread judgment seat of Christ and to be worthy, as she was, of eternal life.
