IN MEMORIUM The handmaid of God, Doctor Constance Tarasar, fell asleep in the Lord on Friday evening, November 7. Dr. Tarasar was a pioneer in the field of Orthodox Christian education, working closely with +Protopresbyter Alexander Schmemann and +Sophie Koulomzin of blessed memory on the Orthodox Christian Education Commission (OCEC), a pan-Orthodox agency aimed at defining and shaping Orthodox Christian education efforts and curriculum development in an American setting. She held numerous positions in the Orthodox Church in America (OCA), including Managing Editor of The Orthodox Church newspaper and Chair of the Department of Religious Education. She also taught at St. Vladimir's Seminary in Yonkers, NY for many years. (Both Fr. David and Basil Kozak had her as one of their professors.) Dr. Tarasar was a remarkable woman who left an indelible legacy on the Church. There is no doubt that she now shares in the fullness of eternal life with Jesus Christ. May her memory be eternal—Vechnaya Pamyat!
